The global climate is changing faster than previously predicted. Droughts, floods and environment-related conflicts have regularly made the news in recent years and are expected to continue to dominate global discourses. This is happening at the same time governments around the region are dealing with old and new political and economic conflicts. Experts agree that the situation is likely to worsen, especially in sub-Saharan Africa including the Horn of African countries.

Responding to these emerging conflicts and climate change threats, the Heritage Institute for Policy Studies (HIPS) invites abstracts for policy papers that address conflict or climate change-related issues. We hope that the experts, through evidence-based policy research, will bring solutions to help society become more resilient, mitigate climate-induced risks and resolve conflicts peacefully.
